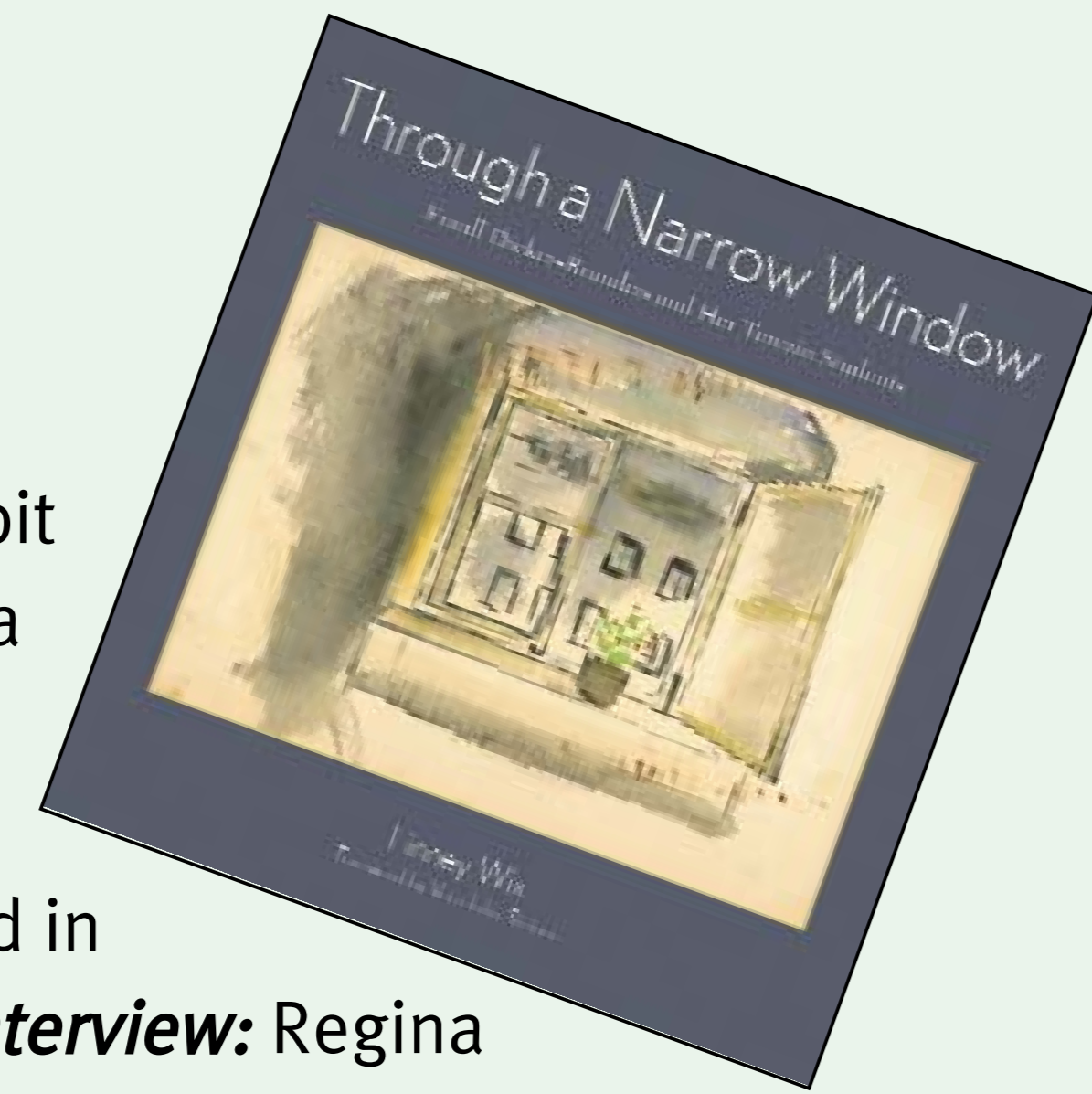

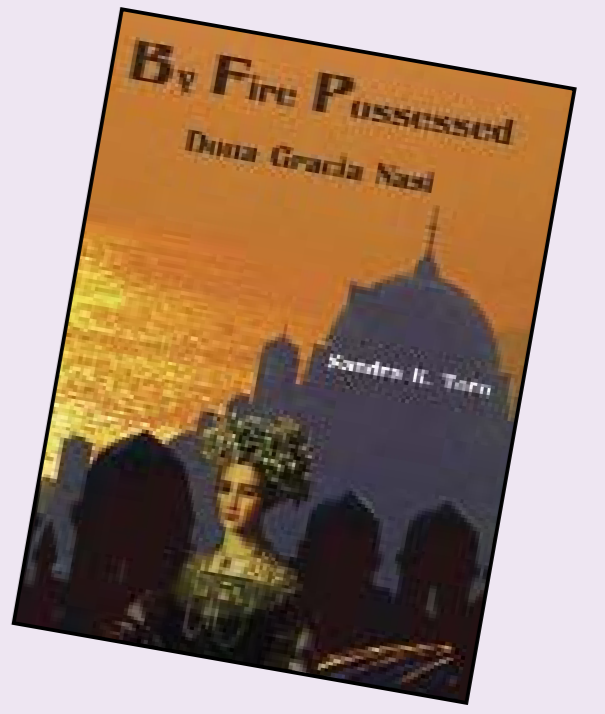
Thursday, February 23

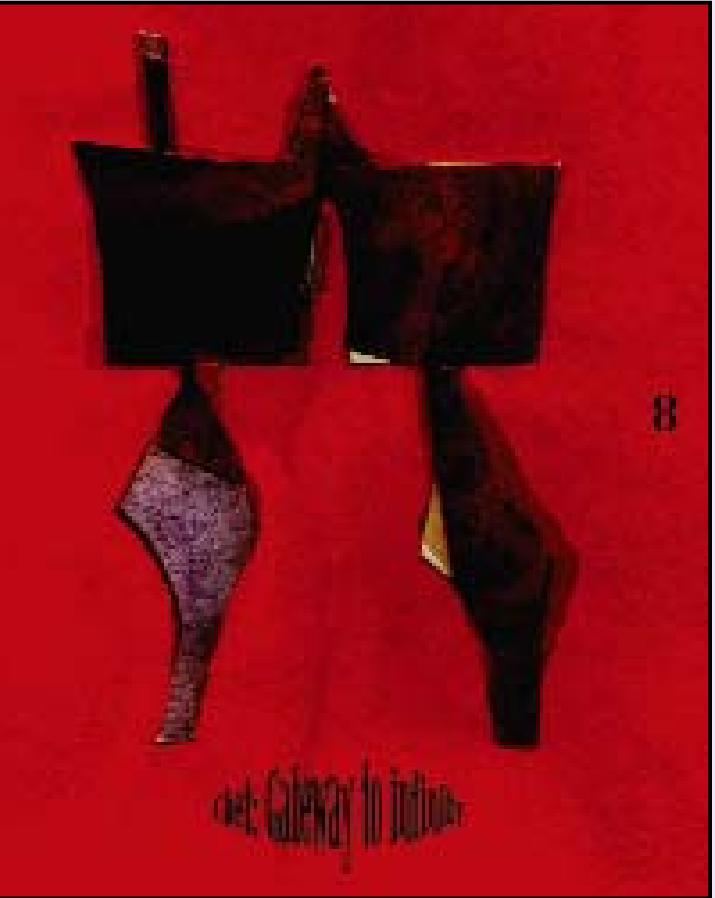
